‘Gen V,’ ‘Sabrina’ actor, 27, dies in solo motorcycle accident

Actor Chance Perdomo, the L.A.-born star of “Gen V” and “Chilling Adventures of Sabrina,” has died in a motorcycle crash, his representatives said. He was 27.

“His passion for the arts and insatiable appetite for life was felt by all who knew him, and his warmth will carry on in those who he loved dearest,” Perdomo’s

representatives said Saturday in a statement. “We ask to please respect the family’s wish for privacy as they mourn the loss of their beloved son and brother.”

There were no other vehicles involved in the incident, which took place Friday, his representatives told The Times. They did not disclose further details about the crash, including its location.

“We can’t quite wrap our heads around this,” the producers of the series “Gen V” said in a statement. “For

those of us who knew him and worked with him, Chance was always charming and smiling, an enthusiastic force of nature, an incredibly talented performer, and more than anything else, just a very kind, lovely person. Even writing about him in the past tense doesn’t make sense.”

Most recently, Perdomo played Andre Anderson on Amazon Prime superhero series “Gen V,” which premiered in September. Production on its second season

will be postponed as a result of his death, the studio said.

“The entire Gen V family is devastated by the sudden passing of Chance Perdomo,” Amazon MGM Studios and Sony Pictures Television said in a statement.

Born in Los Angeles in 1996, Perdomo was raised in Southampton, England. A childhood fascination with young performers on kids’ TV led him to decide early on a career in acting, the British Academy of Film and Television Arts said.

“When I was about 2 years old, I told Mum I want to be two things,” Perdomo told BAFTA in 2019. “I said, ‘I want to be the first Black president of the United States, and I want to be on ‘Barney.’”

He briefly studied law before being offered a role on BBC series “Hetty Feather” in 2017. He got a BAFTA actor nomination for the 2018 BBC film “Killed by My Debt” and received BAFTA’s “Breakthrough Brit” award in 2019 for his role in the Net-

flix series “Chilling Adventures of Sabrina.”

In a video produced for his “Breakthrough Brit” recognition, Perdomo spoke about the power of art and acting to bring about change. “There’s no point in just ranting at someone,” he said. “But if you can connect with them emotionally and have them think outside their peripheral vision to somewhere else, then that can change perspectives and hopefully lead to more of a permanent change.”

Notice of Preparation of a Draft Environmental Impact Report for the McCullough-Victorville Lines 1 and 2 Upgrade Project The City of Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) has prepared an Initial Study and Notice of Preparation (NOP) to notify agencies and interested parties that, as the lead agency, LADWP will prepare an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the proposed McCullough-Victorville Lines 1 and 2 Upgrade (proposed project). McCullough-Victorville (MCC-VIC) Transmission Lines 1 and 2 are two existing 500 kilovolt (kV) electrical power lines which run parallel to each other and are supported on approximately 1,740 single-circuit towers and spanning over 160 miles from McCullough Switching Station in Nevada, through several mountain ranges, into the Mojave Desert and ending at the Victorville Switching Station in California. The project would upgrade the McCullough-Victorville Transmission Lines 1 and 2 circuits to newly rated them as 570kV from their current rating of 500kV. Construction of the proposed project is anticipated to begin in mid-2026 and continue through late-2028. The upgraded MCC-VIC Transmission Lines are anticipated to be fully operational by the end of 2028. The upgrade of the existing McCullough-Victorville Transmission Lines would provide critical transmission capacity and is required to accommodate incoming renewable energy resources along the west of Colorado River Path 46 transmission corridor. This proposed project supports LADWP's goal to transition to a clean energy future, with ongoing efforts to transition from coal to renewable energy, influenced by Los Angeles City Council's vote in 2021 to commit to 100% carbon-free energy. The public comment period for this NOP and review of the Initial Study will commence on April 1, 2024, and conclude on May 1, 2024. 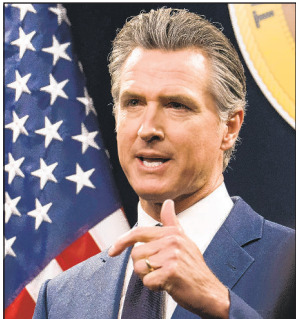
OK, no governor — not even a California governor — can be equated with an American president. And Sacramento is not a little Washington; it's a big Carson City.

That said, the governor's State of the State speech traditionally marks the most festive day of the year in California's Capitol. The 19th century-decor Assembly chamber is jammed with lawmakers, state elected officials, Supreme Court justices, movers and shakers. Most everyone is giddy and on best behavior.

No one has yet shouted, "You're a liar," as some Republicans have during a State of the Union in Washington.

Newsom might well have gotten some GOP boos if he'd read Tuesday's remarks to a live audience. He repeatedly lambasted "red states" and "the poisonous populism of the right."

Still, a State of the State

address is a time when legislators of both parties can embrace and pause in their perpetual polarization. All three branches of government come together for brief fellowship. It's good for the spirit.

And it provides the governor with a valuable platform to promote his agenda to the Legislature in person.

Not showing up seems disrespectful and even insulting. And it's certainly dismissive of an historic institution. Too many are crumbling around us.

The governor's office told reporters that State of the State addresses are only a "relatively recent construct in California." They were merely annual written reports before the reign of Gov. Earl Warren.

Recent? Warren was elected 82 years ago. And since then, every governor — including Newsom, three times — has delivered their speeches in person to a joint session of the Legislature.

For starters, Newsom was inexcusably late this year.

State of the State addresses have traditionally been delivered at the beginning of the year, usually just after the governor unveils his proposed budget in early January. It's summer already.

Newsom initially had planned to address the Legislature in mid-March. But the governor called it off, he said, because the fate of his Proposition 1 — providing housing and treatment for homeless people — still had not been decided. Rubbish.

Then there were "scheduling challenges" with the Legislature and "few available dates" before fall, the governor's office claimed. More nonsense. The Legislature will always accommodate a governor who asks for speaking time — especially when it's one-party rule.

The truth is, Newsom hates reading speeches off teleprompters. "It's anxiety-producing for him," a top aide once told me. He must rehearse several times. That's because of the dyslexia he has struggled with all his life.

He's a master at winging it. And that's probably what he should do with a State of the State speech. Hand over a prepared text to lawmakers, then ad-lib.

Newsom has tried several ways to escape giving in-person major speeches — although when he does deliver them, he performs flawlessly.

As San Francisco mayor in 2008, rather than delivering a customary State of the City speech, Newsom posted a 7½-hour eye-glazer on his YouTube channel. It bombed.

In 2021, the governor gave his State of the State speech in center field of an empty Dodger Stadium. The Assembly chamber that year was out of bounds because tight seating would have risked spreading COVID-19. But an empty stadium? He was widely jeered in the media.

Last year, Newsom abandoned any State of the State pretense. He hit the road on a four-city tour to promote new policies.

This latest duck was a hybrid State of the State address and national political speech — and heavy on the latter.

It was as if the governor was auditioning for a prime-time speaking slot at the Democratic National Convention in August. But don't be surprised if President Biden's protectors insist on reviewing his text first — then demand that he stick to the script. More teleprompter headaches.

If Newsom really has the Potomac bug, he should bone up on major speech-making as governor. Unfortunately, he just passed up a golden opportunity.

Short hike becomes a 10-day wilderness ordeal

Man loses 30 pounds before being rescued in remote Big Basin Redwoods State Park.

Lost in the Santa Cruz wilderness, Lukas McClish started shouting for help, realizing he was pushing his body to the limit after more than a week with almost no food or supplies.

That strategy likely saved his life.

Multiple people heard his cries for help, directing rescue teams to a remote area of Big Basin Redwoods State Park near Foreman Creek. Using a drone, first responders were able to locate the 34-year-old in the remote forest where he'd been lost for 10 days.

McClish, an avid hiker, was rescued June 20 without major injuries and reunited with his family, according to the Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Office.

Photos from the scene showed an emotional reunion as he emerged from the wilderness covered in dirt and scratches, with wild hair and a beard.

He had departed on what he expected to be a short hike 10 days prior, without even a shirt on his back.

"I left with just a pair of my pants and my pair of hiking shoes and a hat," McClish told ABC News. "I had a flashlight and pair of folding scissors — like a Leatherman tool — and that was about it."

He said he lost 30 pounds in those 10 days he was lost, drinking water from streams and waterfalls to stay alive.

At one point, a mountain lion followed him around, but he was never too worried about surviving until the end when he started dreaming about his next meal, he told KSBW-TV of Salinas.

"I didn't bring anything because I thought I was doing a three-hour hike," he said.

While drinking water from nature was McClish's only option, officials caution against the practice.

"Never drink water from a natural source that you haven't purified, even if the water looks clean," a National Park Service post warns. "Water in a stream, river or lake may look clean, but it can still be filled with bacteria, viruses, and parasites that can result in water-borne diseases."

McClish's family had filed a missing person's report when he didn't return home after several days, prompting the Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Office to circulate a bulletin calling him a "missing person at risk."

"This truly was a team effort with the best outcome we could have hoped for," the sheriff's office said in a statement.
